

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension's Working on Wellness Environments (WOW-E) program in partnership with PVAMU Extension is kicking off year 2 of our current 5 year technical assistance cycle. We are excited to encourage your county to participate in year 2 programs and outreach.

WOW-E utilizes a community development approach to support local teams in transforming their communities by improving access to healthy foods and safe and accessible physical activity environments with an emphasis on walking.

As part of the year 2 technical assistance cycle, 2-4* local practitioners and advocates from multi-sector entities are eligible to apply for registration and travel support to the Urban and Municipal Parks Workshops.
